
#### Connect the dots

John 19:17-18 - "Carrying his own cross, he went out to the place of the Skull...There they crucified him, and with him two others."

Jesus' crucifixion, central to the New Testament.






#### Connect the dots

Matthew 2:2 - "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

The Star of Bethlehem guiding the Wise Men to Jesus.






#### Connect the dots

Matthew 6:9-13 - "This, then, is how you should pray: 'Our Father in heaven..."

Jesus teaches the Lord's Prayer as a model for prayer.






#### Connect the dots

Matthew 3:16 - "As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water...and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove."

The Holy Spirit appears as a dove at Jesus' baptism. (Also Genesis 8:11 for Noah's dove.)






#### Connect the dots

Jonah 1:17 - "Now the Lord provided a huge fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights."

Jonah swallowed by a great fish (often depicted as a whale).





#### Connect the dots

Luke 15:4-6 - "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one... When he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders."

The parable of the lost sheep. (Also Psalm 23:1, "The Lord is my shepherd.")






#### Connect the dots

Matthew 21:7 - "They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on."

Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday.






#### Connect the dots

Daniel 6:22 - "My God sent his angel, and he shut the mouths of the lions."

Daniel in the lions' den. (Also Revelation 5:5, "The Lion of the tribe of Judah.")






#### Connect the dots

Matthew 2:1-11 (implied) - "Magi from the east came to Jerusalem... They presented him with gifts."

The Wise Men traditionally traveled by camel, though not explicitly stated. (Also Matthew 19:24, "easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle.")






#### Connect the dots

Genesis 6:14 - "So make yourself an ark of cypress wood... This is how you are to build it."

Noah's Ark to survive the flood. (Could also refer to the Ark of the Covenant, Exodus 25:10.)






#### Connect the dots

Matthew 14:17-19 - "'We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish, they answered... And he directed the people to sit down."

The feeding of the 5,000 with fish and loaves.






#### Connect the dots

Matthew 14:17-19 (same as above) - "We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish' ... He gave thanks and broke the loaves."

Paired with the fish in the miracle of feeding the multitude.






#### Connect the dots

John 12:13 - "They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, Hosanna!"

Palm Sunday, where palm branches welcomed Jesus. (Palm trees also symbolize victory and peace, e.g., Psalm 92:12.)





#### Connect the dots

Genesis 3:1 - "Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the Lord goa had made."

The serpent in the Garden of Eden tempting Eve.






#### Connect the dots

1 Samuel 17:49 - "Reaching into his bag and taking out a stone, he slung it and struck the Philistine on the forehead."

David uses a sling to defeat Goliath.





#### Connect the dots

1 Samuel 16:23 - "Wherever the spirit from God came on Saul, David would take up his llyre and play."

David plays the harp (or lyre) to soothe King Saul.
